We learned that a "no-dig bed" is the quickest and easiest way to begin a vegetable patch that quite literally composts itself while providing a nutrient-rich home for vegetables. After some refreshingly hard work we were happy to see our labor come to fruition as you can see in the photo below. All of the volunteers enjoyed their time on The Farm immensely and were happy to know of a potential organization with which to volunteer their time upon completion of our Master Gardener training.
